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## FALL '21 ARTIST-IN-RESIDENCE

Dancer, choreographer, and educator **Nailah Randall-Bellinger** is in residence at Harvard Dance Center creating a new work commissioned by the Harvard University Committee on the Arts (HUCA), and with support from Harvard Radcliffe Institute and the Presidential Initiative on Harvard and the Legacy of Slavery.

The work, titled *Initiation– In Love Solidarity*, is a choreographic narrative that explores the physical embodiment of the Middle Passage, and the resilience and evolving identity of women of the African diaspora. A film component of the work and live performance will be presented in various formats this fall. Randall-Bellinger will also be visiting TDM dance credit courses and the Hutchins Center Fellowship Program.
